Professional Summary	<p>Presently i am the Vice Chancellor of Busitema University and before that i served as Founder Dean of Busitema University Faculty of Health sciences. This position involved establishing the Faculty of Health sciences which included Curriculum development, Resource mobilization, Advocacy with internal and external stakeholders, Academic, Financial and General administration of the Faculty.</p> <p>Over the past five years, I have presided over the evolution of a Faculty to the present staffing level of Fifty six (56) with six accredited (6) academic programs and a student's population of 500. The school has 19 satellite training sites which serve as community outreach Platforms. The faculty has attracted international funding in form of scholarships and secondment experts and research grants.</p> <p>Before my current position of Dean, I was Chair of the Department of Pharmacology and Therapeutics at Makerere University for nine (9) years. This position involved managing a team of at least 30 staff and directing their efforts toward the key University functions of Training, Research and service to the community.
